

What Does Concerned Citizens In Action Do?

- CCIA's mission is "To Hold Government Accountable to the Public While Serving the Public Interest."
- CCIA listens to YOU, the citizens, about your concerns with your government and its processes.
- CCIA researches public records and documents for information that you may want to know.
- CCIA educates the public regarding government process, and how to become more involved.
- CCIA attends government public meetings and reports on events related to the public interest.
- CCIA holds public meetings and public forums so that your voice is heard.
- CCIA writes letters to the editor reflecting your input.
- CCIA corresponds with government officials, asking questions, or requesting assistance for public interest.
- CCIA facilitates meetings for the public regarding government projects, such as the rezone process of the Park to "Park" at the Port of Camas-Washougal.
- CCIA meets with government officials, such as council persons, commissioners, representatives, and congress persons to bring them the public concerns.
- CCIA educates themselves by researching, utilizing professional consultants, and talking with the public.
- CCIA develops educational information which is presented to the public and government officials.
- CCIA has a website, where information regarding your government is regularly updated.
- CCIA holds regular bi-monthly board meetings, has a nine-member board of directors, and many regular members supporting our mission.
